Objective of the Scholarships

These scholarships are to promote the consideration of the auction profession as a full-time career for people who are honest, intelligent and sincere in their pursuit of the lifeir goals.

Up to four scholarships will be awarded in amounts up to \$750 each.

Two of the scholarships are designated for auctioneers for auction related education (Auction school tuition, CAI, NAA/AMI seminars)

The remaining two scholarships may be used for auction related or non auction related education.

Who can apply?

- *Beginning Auctioneers*
- *Veteran Auctioneers*
- *Relatives of an active KAA member in good standing that has or will be graduating from an accredited high school or have completed the past year at a qualified university or school of higher education.*

Please mail your completed scholarship application along with your essay to Richie McGinnis, 260 Bruners Chapel Rd. Harrodsburg KY 40330. Applications must be received by January 15, 2011, but can be sent anytime.

Applicants must write a brief essay explaining why they are interested in auctioneering as a career and why they are applying for the scholarship. Scholarships will be awarded at the KAA Annual Convention, February 20, 2011.
